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

- To gain formal recognition for the Polish language within the Scottish education system
- To make Polish available in Scottish schools as part of the 1+2 Languages programme
- To campaign to set up National 4 & 5 and Higher exams in Polish
- To retain the Polish A-level qualifications in place until the SQA creates equivalent Scottish exams
- To implement an option for teachers of Polish to be registered in the Scottish education system.

Our goals continued:

- To assist with Continuous Professional Development opportunities for teachers to gain additional qualifications in Polish as a Foreign Language
- To continue the dialogue with Polish Supplementary Schools and the wider community and articulate collective views on education issues
- To be a point of contact for the Polish and Scottish governments and institutions in both countries in matters concerning the teaching of Polish in schools
