


Percentage of primary schools providing an L2 entitlement








No. of primary schools providing an L2 by language








Percentage of primary schools providing an L3 entitlement







No. of primary schools providing an L3 by language




Other L3 languages provided by primary schools








Percentage of secondary schools providing an








No. of secondary schools providing an L2 by








Percentage of secondary schools providing an L3 entitlement








No. of secondary schools providing an L3 (by language)

Where are we now with 1+2 post-pandemic?

• Funding from Scottish Government-£2.4 million for 2021/22 (total = £35.6 million since 2013/14)

PRIMARY:

- Covid appears to have had some impact on delivery of the full L2 entitlement when compared with 2019.
- Nearly all primary schools reported they provided an L2, either in full or partially.
- More primary schools also reported they were providing an L3 entitlement, compared to 2019.

SECONDARY:

- Progress toward implementation appears stable when compared to 2019.
- All secondary schools reported they provided an L2 entitlement, either in full or partially.
- Most secondary schools also reported they provided an L3 entitlement.
