

Promoting Learning Chinese and about China in Scotland

OUTLINE SCEN PLAN 2015-2018

SCEN is a voluntary association which aims to promote the teaching and learning of Chinese and about China in Scotland. It works to support Scotland's Strategy for Stronger Engagement with China by reaching out to schools, colleges, universities, agencies and associations which are keen to provide collaborative leadership and opportunities.

POLICY

- To work with the Scottish Government, in particular the China and Americas Team and the Curriculum Unit and its Languages Team, in helping to meet the targets and evaluate the progress of Scotland's China Strategy and its Languages Plan.
- To respond to the needs and the issues raised by all sectors at the Cross Party Group on China at the Scottish Parliament, including the wide range of commercial interests represented by the China Scotland Business Forum, the 48 Group Club (The Icebreakers) and the China Britain Business Council.
- > To support the relationship between Hanban and the Confucius Institutes and Confucius Classroom Hubs in Scotland.
- To link with the First Secretary for Scottish Affairs and the UK Embassy in Beijing, the Embassy for the PR of China in London and the Consulate General in Edinburgh, to support Scotland's links with China and to facilitate its participation in UK connections.
- To support Local Authorities, Headteachers, Schools and national agencies in Scotland, in their efforts to implement the national languages strategy and connections with China in Scotland's schools.
- To work with Universities and Colleges, to support their teaching work in Chinese and about China, research into the teaching and learning of Chinese, and collaborative research projects with Universities in China.
