### **Overview of Project**

The CES&L (Erasmus+) Careers Module for HE Students of Languages is a two year Erasmus+ funded project co-ordinated by Institute of Technology, Tralee, Ireland and a collaboration between partners from Austria, Bulgaria, Germany, Italy, Ireland, Poland and the UK.

#### **Workshop Structure**

The output, 10 workshops, is a resource for practitioners working with Modern Languages students that aims to enhance their employability by engaging them in work related activities as part of their academic studies. The Project Team has worked with employers across Europe to seek their views on how HEIs can support students to become more employable and recognise the significance of their modern languages degree in the international job market. This has informed the adaptation of the generic AHECS (Association of Higher Education Careers Services in Ireland) Employability module into a resource localised to, and translated for, each of the member countries. Each workshop has comprehensive facilitator notes that include: an introduction, activities and timings, (with information and activity sheets supplied), learning outcomes, assessment strategies and Power-Point slides to support the facilitator. 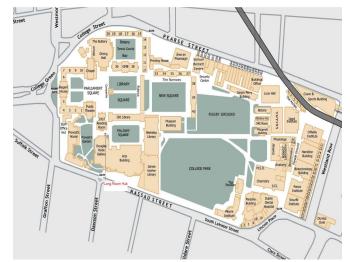
